

The Sixteenth Asian Logic Conference will be held at Nazarbayev University Astana, Kazakhstan,17-21 June 2019. It will be the second Asian Logic Conference since its status changed from an ASL(the Association for Symbolic Logic)-sponsored meeting to an official ASL meeting by

# February 2020

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ASL Council action in May 2016.

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From 1981 to 2008, the Asian Logic Conference has been held triennially and rotated among countries in the Asia-Pacific region. The previous meetings took place in Singapore (1981), Bangkok (1984), Beijing (1987), Tokyo (1990), Singapore (1993), Beijing (1996), Hsi-Tou (1999), Chongqing (2002), Novosibirsk (2005), and Kobe (2008). In 2008, the East Asian and Australasian Committees of the Association for Symbolic Logic decided to shorten the three-year cycle to two. The new two-year cycle began with the meeting in Singapore (2009), and subsequent meetings have been held in Wellington (2011), Guangzhou (2013), Mumbai (2015), Daejeon (2017).

The conference will be co-located with the 14th International Conference on Computability and Randomness (CCR 2019).
